

Youth Writing Internship

826 Boston recruits a group of enthusiastic, dedicated interns for the fall, spring and summer semesters. Interns will work individually and collectively with each other, our staff of nine full-time employees, and a large group of volunteers.

Youth Writing Interns join 826 Boston's In-Schools Team, supporting staff in program development for the upcoming school year in the Writers' Rooms. Interns will assist with research regarding the early stages of upcoming book projects, College Essay Boot Camp Month, discover new literature to add to the Writers' Rooms library, develop creative writing prompts, and other projects as needed. This is an opportunity to get experience in creative arts education, learn about the day-to-day operations of Writers' Rooms, and join the network of national 826 chapters while building job skills, advancing your resume, and acquiring excellent references. Applicants must be over the age of 18 but need not be currently enrolled in an academic program.

Youth Writing Interns commit to 16 hours per week of unpaid work for a minimum of three months. Named one of GOOD magazine's "30 Places We Want to Work," 826 Boston is a vibrant work environment, bustling with staff, interns, students, and volunteers.

826 Boston is a nonprofit youth writing and publishing organization that empowers traditionally underserved students ages 6-18 to find their voices, tell their stories, and gain communication skills to succeed in school and in life. 826 Boston is part of a national network of youth writing centers, founded by the award-winning author Dave Eggers.
