826 Boston is a nonprofit youth writing and publishing organization that empowers traditionally underserved students ages 6-18 to find their voices, tell their stories, and gain communication skills to succeed in school and in life. Our high-impact programs are based on the understanding that great leaps in learning can occur with one-on-one attention, and that writing skills are fundamental to future success.

826 Boston is part of a national network of youth writing centers, founded by the award-winning author Dave Eggers. In 2013, the 826 network garnered the prestigious American Literary Prize awarded by the Library of Congress. Since opening in 2007, 826 Boston has delivered its free youth writing and tutoring programs to more than 20,000 students. 826 Boston's youth writers have published their work in *The New York Times*, *The Boston Globe*, and in numerous award-winning 826 Boston books, including *A Place for Me in the World*, which was hailed as a "triumph of middle school education" by *The Boston Globe*. 826 Boston is an equal opportunity employer committed to being a multicultural organization.

O'Bryant School of Math and Science.

- At least one year of experience teaching or tutoring in writing to students grades 7-12 in an urban setting
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to adapt to various working and management styles
- Seeks to embody 826 Boston's values around diversity, equity, and inclusion
- Enthusiastic belief in the mission of 826 Boston

Candidates may also have experience in the following areas:

- Ability to use Adobe InDesign, Photoshop, and Illustrator
- Journalism, creative writing, and/or book publishing
- Proficiency in Spanish



Primary Responsibilities:

- Support in-school and after-school programming at the 826 Boston Writers' Room
- Provide direct service to high school students seeking support with writing assignments during daily in-center class visits, student drop-ins, writing workshops, and publication projects
- Assist with data collection, including tracking student visits
- Support the upkeep and beautification of the center
- Provide administrative support to Writers' Room after-school projects, including a school-wide literary magazine, slam poetry team, and journalism club
- Communicate project progress to staff supervisor and seek counsel when help is needed to execute on goals
- Support Writers' Room volunteers; co-lead debrief sessions
- Help coordinate Writers' Room publishing projects and book release parties

Stipend: Up to \$3,000

Commitment: The suggested schedule is two days per week for eight hours. Schedule arrangement is negotiable and can be discussed with 826 Boston staff.
