## Public Transportation:

The EMK is a five-minute walk from Ruggles on the Orange Line and a 15-minute walk from the 66 bus.

## Parking:

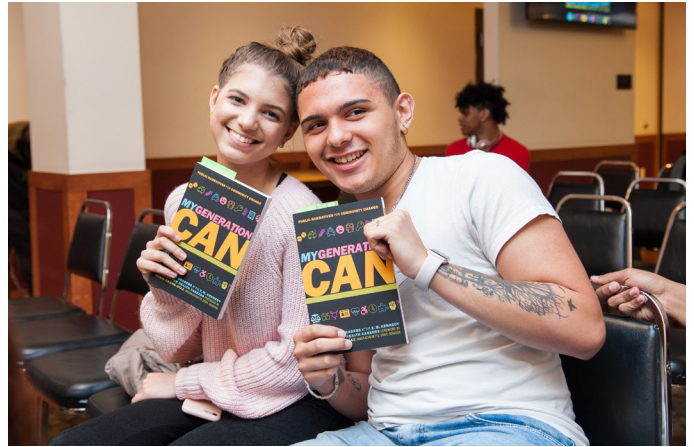
Driving is not recommended. Metered street parking is limited; garages are available, but no validation can be given from the Writers' Room.

## Accessibility:

The EMK is up four flights of stairs. An elevator and handicap entrance is available.

A unisex/gender-neutral restroom is located on the second floor of Nightingale Hall, which is internally connected to Holmes Hall.

A water fountain and kitchen with a refrigerator and microwave are available for volunteers to use.

## Check-In Procedure:

Enter the Writers' Room through Holmes Hall door 41 A (entrance has a step up) and proceed to the fourth floor using the stairs. When exiting the stairwell, turn right and follow the signs to the Writers' Room, located next door to Northeastern's Writing Center in Room 422.

The handicap entrance to Holmes Hall is located at 37 Leon Street. Use the elevator right inside the door to reach the fourth floor. When exiting the elevator, turn left and follow the signs to the Writers' Room.
